Media Bookings

The HACC Libraries encourage faculty to schedule media for classes at least 3 business days in advance of the show date to reduce scheduling conflicts and allow for delivery to your campus, if needed.

To book media, search for the desired title in the HACC catalog from the library's homepage, lib2.hacc.edu. The HACC catalog is under the Books & Media menu. Once a title is found, look for the Book This Title link in the upper right corner of the screen.

Booking requests may also be submitted to library Circulation staff at any campus, via phone, email or in person.

Booked items must be picked up and returned to the library.

To extend a booking, contact the staff at your campus library.

Rentals

Faculty may request media rentals from the Penn State Media collection using the ILL request form or by email to Diane Wiedemann at dlwiedem@hacc.edu.

Rentals are for 3 days only.

Copyright Law:

In general Copyright Law protects literary works, musical works, dramatic works, choreographic works, artistic works, audiovisual works, sound recordings, and software.

Copyright Law gives the copyright owner the exclusive right to reproduce, distribute, modify, and publicly display the works.

Use of copyrighted materials by educators is governed by the statute itself, and by guidelines that have been developed to interpret the Fair Use exception that is set forth in the statute. The responsibility for following copyright law rests with the individual faculty member.
